

For the March 23rd virtual public meeting, we would ask if the Board would consider moving some or all of the funds from line items 6, 7, 13, 14, 15 and 21 and allocate those funds to security, additional park/beach access and landscaping improvements. Just thinking if a person is capable of portaging their canoe/kayak to the beach why would they need a designated launch, most folks have their own portable chairs/toys to enjoy the park/beach, and cyclists generally carry cell phones and/or repair kits to use when in trouble.

Have cell phone/electric car recharging stations be considered? Not saying they are needed at this point. You might want to ensure the groundwork is put in place for the future since there are planned parking lot and electric improvements.

On a personal note, a new restroom is a good use of funds and the expenditure doesn't appear out of line when you consider the cost of updating a residential bathroom.

Please send the link for this meeting when available. We might not be home in time to attend due to travel but will try.

I have thought long and hard about the park ever since ideas and a plan were developed last year. Yes, there are things I would like to see, and some not so much. Here are my thoughts.

When my son was young, the only way we could play on a playground other than our little old metal swingset was to drive to parks in either New Lisbon or Mauston where they have nice playground areas. It would have been helpful had there been a park in Germantown at the time. I am sure it is very nice that many of the new developments in the Town have playgrounds or play areas; however, they are private for that development's use only. There really is nothing to do in Germantown for the young future residents and owners in the way of public playgrounds.

Handicap accessibility fishing areas would be a great feature. I have handicapped family and friends who cannot make it to a dock to fish or to just sit unless there is accessibility. None of us are getting any younger, and accessibility may be what the rest of us need in the maybe not so near future. A parking area that is closer to the lake would improve accessibility. It would also provide overflow parking from the main lot for large gathering in the town hall. Adding benches and replacing/adding picnic tables for seating or picnicking would improve everyone's accessibility to seating in nature.

As for walking paths, I would be all for them, especially from a safety aspect. As soon as snow melts, the walking picks up on the roads. Roads were meant, developed, and put in for vehicular traffic, not as walking paths. However, people use them as such. What causes the problems with pedestrians on the roadway are: many do not walk on the shoulder on the appropriate side (they should be walking on the shoulder against traffic), couples and groups walk side by side, walk in the middle of the lanes, and do not move off the pavement when vehicles approach which prevents vehicles from driving in their proper lanes and causing dangerous weaving around pedestrians. I have witnessed this many times in my travels here. I have also taken complaints from residents about pedestrians causing traffic issues. Walking paths through the park would help reduce pedestrian/traffic issues. Besides, weekenders who have a small mostly treeless lot here can enjoy a walk in a rural wooded setting among the modern developments to enjoy the fauna and flora offered by a park.

The park restrooms definitely need help. Since the current building has structural issues, they have been deemed unsafe to use. At the time they were originally installed, they were to also serve as a tornado shelter for park occupants. Improving/replacing them would be a huge improvement.

The bridge spans the wetland to reach the docks and provides a scenic backdrop for photography. But over the years, its power pole structure as well as its decking have started rotting and look bad. Its life expectancy is well past. Replacement with something that will last longer, be easier to maintain, and be safer would be helpful to the of use of the park. Having a bridge in the park is fun from a child's perspective. My son sure thought that. The bridge was a low structure spanning a little back-water area of the lake where you can safely watch tadpoles, ducks, turtles, deer, turkeys, and the like, as well as being able to view all the different plants, practice identifying different kinds of trees and plants, take shade under a tree, or walk off-trail. It was a place to teach about and enjoy nature.

I enjoy bicycling and canoeing but do not get to do these as I would like. The improvements would benefit those who are active in these endeavors and who want to have an alternative place to do them. I do question, though, including a bicycle fixing station. Most people either just stop where the issue happens rather than wait to get to a designated fixing station, have a cell phone and call someone to get their bicycle home if there is an issue, or even carry their own small tools for small fixes. As for a canoe/kayak launch and racks, I am thinking these really will not be used much due to concern of theft of racked craft, and most people just push off from in the water as they are low watercraft to launch.

The Town's recent letter essentially stated that Phase I park improvements would be comprised of about ¾ of the funding coming from two grants, another almost ¼ from already collected impact fees, plus a modest amount from a designated park fund. Then Phase II and Phase III would be in the future, depending on how Phase I went and depending on any additional grants that may be available later for the later phases that would go along with any impact fees that would be collected. Grants are a "use it or lose it" deal. We are a small town with a small park, and someone higher up thought enough of our applications to choose us for these grants to improve our small part of the world. We were fortunate to be chosen. If we do not use the grants, then they most likely would go to some city to enhance their already well-established park systems. Where can you find free money of almost ¾ of a million dollars to make improvements that will benefit the Town and anyone who visits the park? Granted, nothing is ever free; there will be some maintenance and upkeep but so far it looks like those costs will be minimal and will not affect taxes.

One of the goals as noted in the Comprehensive Plan of the Town of Germantown is to "improve the Town-owned park, to promote regional access to Castle Rock Lake for swimming, fishing, and canoeing/kayaking. Park improvements will also be completed to accommodate bicyclists using the Town's multi-use trails." I think the plans of Phase I will accomplish that and am FOR Phase I. Some maintenance and upkeep is already part of the yearly Town budget, for things such as mowing the park area, cutting trees, and caring for the docks and restrooms. Insurance would be a minimal increase. The park as we know it currently was not created all at once.

As for Phase II and Phase III with the disc golf, it sounds like a great idea to start, but I question that. I would hope the Board would take the wait and see approach and then revisit Phase II and Phase III at a later date for grants and possible funding that would cover the costs without burdening the taxpayers.

Wisconsin State Statute 60.23 (g) gives the Town Board the ability to "appropriate money for the conservation of natural resources or for payment to a bona fide nonprofit organization for the conservation of natural resources within the town or beneficial to the town." The grants would help accomplish that, by preserving the land for nature and public use, rather than being built on by any developer who may close public access to the lake and remove the wooded natural feature. I believe the park is a natural resource. The Board would be holding up their end by fulfilling their part in the Comprehensive plan by doing the improvements to the park that would provide a safe place to enjoy nature before there are no natural areas left to enjoy. Besides, having a modernized park is a very big selling point for anyone looking to sell their property here or looking to buy and move here. This park benefits everyone and not just existing property owners that are not in developments or who are in older developments.

Unsurprisingly, due to demographic trends and development expansion by 2020, assessed value equalled \$382,491,400.00 Taxes collected of \$2,530,639.00 in 1990 rocketed to \$7,898,550.00 in 2020.

As a long time resident, I would expect that the amenities provided for residents and visitors alike would somewhat parallel the tremendous increase in the tax base. Therefore, I was pleased to see the proposal for further public land development that is now termed "reckless" by Mr. Keene. Being an individual who prefers transparency of details, I would like specifics on the contingency and engineering costs. Susan,

As a full-time resident of one of Germantown's "developments", I am in support of the proposed Germantown Park.

In his letter to the Juneau County Star Times (dated 3/11/21), Jim Keene, a Sanitary District Member and candidate for the Town Board states that the developments have "recreation right in the own yard". While this is somewhat true, some of these recreational items are in need of repair (disc golf) or not fully built out (playground). My wife and I have grandkids that we have taken to the playground in Mauston before if was removed and they enjoyed playing there rather than in our development. I would prefer to have something closer to our area.

Also, Germantown is more than just "developments". I feel that all the residents of the town should have access to improved recreation and access to the lake. We live in a beautiful area and that all residents should be able to enjoy it.

I have seen the detail breakdown of the preliminary estimate of the costs (dated 3/10/20) – they have been shared within the development and not supported by the developer, along with Mr. Keene. Given this information, I have a few questions that may be able to be answered at the virtual meeting:

- The total based on the email from Gregg Haunroth totals \$1.974M. Does this include the contingencies and engineering costs that were included in the 3/10/20 preliminary estimates? Yes
- Have there been multiple bids sent out for these estimates? Not yet, after reviewing feedback like yours, the board will vote and if we move forward bids would be in the Fall
- What is the estimated timeframe for completing the different phases? Phase 1 will take Phase one will take about 18 months
- If approved, is it possible that phase 1 gets completed and phase 2 and 3 not get done? Yes Phase 1 has been designed so it can the extent of development if we choose not to move forward with Phases 2 & 3.
- Will this be put to public vote or will it be decided by the town board? When would this decision be made? The board has already approved the creation of the plans which included a public hearing and the grants writing to get the grant. Next Tuesday the Board will review the public input, both recent and from the past survey of taxpayers, and either approve or deny the park.
- If this decision is made to NOT build out the park, is it a done deal that the town would lose the \$432K in grant money or is there a contingency for those dollars? The \$432K can ONLY be used for the park we submitted to the DNR.

Thank you and the Town Board for sending out this information and soliciting feedback.

Currently the only access points to the lake on the west arm are Buckhorn State Park on county G and the main park, which are fee based, two unimproved launches on the Little Yellow which don't work well with larger boats and are 1/4 mile away from the main lake and the Pine Cove and Dirty Turtle, private businesses. This would be a way to pay for improvements and maintenance and it is paid for by those who wish to use it. This grant that you are talking about is still taxpayer money. I do not wish to increase the burden on taxpayers now or in the future.

As an owner in the Stonegate property I received the details of what I would consider some very unique spending options of \$2,000,000 on park updates and expansion.

I'm not here too bash anyone's dreams, yet I do have some concerns.

I have been a member of the Planning Commission for the city of Hales corners and was for 12 years, I deal with budgets not only when I was with the city but also with my company which is a multi-million in revenue technology company here in the Milwaukee area. I'm very blessed with the knowledge to be able to read and understand budgets, I understand where dollars come from I also understand where people want to put dollars.

All that being said I'm coming from a position of understanding and I'd like to understand more about this park and the extension of the current park, while I see the budget activities on the documentation that been shipped around, I have concerns on who the organization that both of you belong to only received one quote for items that are 10 X the normal budget that we would find here in this area of the state.

I also have concerns on why this is needed now, why would you build a Frisbee golf course? This is one of the most useless activities of land in the open market today there are plenty of studies that show the minimal use of these facilities and the damage this activity causes to the environment. "The discs used in this sport are not your average Frisbees — they are composed of hardened plastic with dense, narrow edges and are designed to be spun over long distances at speeds of more than 70 mph. Consequently, this sport raises safety and environmental issues that should not be ignored."

The maintenance alone is not in your forthcoming budget and that's another point I'd like to bring up your budget for the future. Nor do I see an environmental impact study with the DNR, and the U.S. Forest Service.

You seem to think that just because of the growth in the Pavloski development, you will keep receiving these dollars while that's good and all relying on something that is not in hand can be very difficult to budget for, and should not be taken lightly.

I have taken a survey of 47 different people in the Stonegate community's, all but three individual never have gone to that park, and so to tell individuals and to decide that this park is needed for people of that community you are sadly mistaken. The people in that complex got to the lake not the park.

I highly recommend you and the remaining members of the board table this issue in order to get better facts, to get deeper information and to find better ways of spending these dollars, a park and additional greenspace while lovely... But during a pandemic and coming out of this pandemic is not the prudent choice to move forward.

As somebody who spends six months out of the year in my favorite city's of Germantown and Mauston & new Lisbon. I firmly believe this is a waste of your taxpayer dollars.

I look forward to having a conversation with any member of the board to give you deeper details from a Planning Commission standpoint as well as from a homeowner in the Stonegate complex.

I look forward to a conversation and to continue to follow this going forward as I dig into more of the open records on the conversation.
